The regular meeting of the Lexington City Council was called to order at 7:00 P. M. by Mayor Spencer Johansen in the City Council Chambers at City Hall.

It was moved by Alderman Stover and seconded by Alderman Franklin to approve the Treasurer's Report including the first half of February's bills in the amount of \$43,027.45 and the second half in the amount of \$181,875.69. Motion carried unanimously.
