- 5. Ability to pass a personal interview, physical and drug screen when applicable.

The employee must be available and present for work as scheduled; be available for after hour calls 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and perform all functions of the job safely and efficiently at all times in compliance with all safety regulations and policies for the safety and welfare of the employee, co-workers and the public. Must be able to attend and participate in job related meetings, seminars and continuous education training and courses. This position requires the employee to assist the other city departments as needed.
